What you will need:

- A Measuring Tape
- · Crochet Hook/ Knitting Needles
- · Your Choice of yarn (Make sure it is a full skein/ball)

Guide: How Much Yarn Will You Need For That Blanket?

- Step 1: Chain Foundation Row to measure 3 inches past recommended width dimension. Depending on the pattern it may be best if you work the first two rows so you know the exact width the blanket will turn out to be.

 Make sure to account for the patterns stitch count requirements
- Step 2: Work as many rows as you can using up the entire skein of yarn.
- Step 3: Measure how many full rows you were able to make with one skein/ball of yarn.
- Step 4: Divide Total length for blanket dimensions by the length made by one skein/ball of yarn.

This will tell you how many skeins of that exact yarn you will need for that exact blanket pattern and blanket size.
