US TERMINOLOGY



Materials

YARN

Use the same yarn you used in the inner body of the blanket

OTHER MATERIALS

Crochet Hook used in blanket yarn needle measuring tape scissors stitch markers (at least 4) Paper and Pen/Pencil

STITCH ABBREVIATIONS

ch / Chain sp/ Space sc/ Single Crochet hdc/ Half Double Crochet

Instructions

SETTING UP THE FOUNDATION

Looking at the sides of your blanket, identify where your blanket is is inverted the most.

Taking your tape measure and stitch markers, find the inverted location and enter into the blanket one more inch. Extend your tape measure and line the tape with this spot. Follow the tape measure and mark where the tape measure hits your first row and your last row of your blanket.

Repeat on the other side of your blanket.

Take your paper and pen/pencil. Draw a Rectangle on your paper to represent your blanket.

Count the number of stitches that are between the 2 stitch markers in the first row. Write that number down.

Count the number of stitches that are between the 2 stitch markers in the last row. Write that number down.

Now let's count the number of stitches that will be along the sides of our blanket.













Instructions

SETTING UP THE FOUNDATION

Looking at the rows of your blanket:

If your row begins or ends with a Single Crochet Stitch or Half Double Crochet you will make one stitch in the side of that row.

If your row begins or ends with a Double Crochet Stitch or Chain 2 or Chain 3 you will make two stitches in the side of that row.

If it will help, pull on your rows to better identify where the rows are.

Count the number of stitches you will be adding to the side of your blanket.

Write that down on your paper.

Now it's time to chain our foundation.

Start by chaining the number of stitches along the top of the rectangle.

Once you reach that number of stitches, mark the last chain with a stitch marker.

SETTING UP THE FOUNDATION

Now chain the number of stitches you wrote down the side of the rectangle.

Mark that last stitch with a stitch marker. Repeat for the bottom side of the blanket and the last side of the rectangle.

Once you have chained all the stitches around the rectangle, join the last chain to the first chain with a slip stitch.


Foundation Row Complete.



Ch 1, Hdc in same stitch you just slip st into to close foundation row. Make one Hdc in each chain, make 4 hdc in each chain marked with a stitch marker.

Each ch marked with a stitch marker is a corner.

To close Rnd 1 make 4 hdc in the last chain then sl st from behind to close off round.







Instructions

Rnd 2:

Ch 1, extend ch, Hdc in the stitch just before. Make one Hdc in each stitch around, in the corner 4 hdc, make one hdc in the first st, 2 hdc in the second and third st, one hdc in the fourth st. Looking at the two stitches with two hdc stitches in them, mark the very first hdc with a stitch marker.

To close Rnd 2 make 1 hdc in the first st, 2 hdc in the second and third st, and one hdc in the fourth st. Then sl st from behind to close round.

Rnd 3 - 9:

Ch 1, extend ch, Hdc in the stitch just before. Make one Hdc in each stitch around, in the corner 4 hdc, make one hdc in the first st, 2 hdc in the second and third st, one hdc in the fourth st. Looking at the two stitches with two hdc stitches in them, mark the very first hdc with a stitch marker.

To close each rnd make 1 hdc in the first st, 2 hdc in the second and third st, and one hdc in the fourth st. Then sl st from behind to close round.









REPEAT ROW 3 FOR REST OF PATTERN.

NO SPECIAL LAST ROW INSTRUCTION.

TIE OFF. WEAVE IN YOUR ENDS
